*NYDIS's Board of Directors responds to statements made by Ann Coulter in her newly published book, Godless: The Church of Liberalism (Crown Forum), accusing 9/11 widows of using their husbands' deaths for their own political gain.*

Recently the right-wing pundit Ann Coulter lashed out at politically active 9/11 widows whose husbands perished at the World Trade Center. To quote Ms. Coulter, "These broads are millionaires, lionized on TV and in articles about them, reveling in their status as celebrities and stalked by grief-arazzis. I've never seen people enjoying their husbands' deaths so much."

- **NYC Katrina In-Service Training for Case Managers**

In May, NYDIS was awarded funding through 2006 to staff and host the NYC Katrina Unmet Needs Roundtable. Case managers working with Katrina or Rita survivors are required to attend an in-service training prior to presenting at the Roundtable. The purpose of these trainings is to provide case managers with a better understanding of the workings of the Roundtable and to help increase the likelihood that a client's needs could be funded. ### ■ **Congress and White House Release Katrina Findings**

The House of Representatives conducted a study on the local, state and federal emergency response plans in preparation for Katrina. It is available free online:

### ■ **BEA Provides Grants to NYC Katrina Evacuees**

The Black Equity Alliance (BEA) has announced individual and family grants for Katrina Evacuees currently residing or having resided in NYC. The grants are in the amounts of \$300 to \$500 for single applicants and up to \$800 for families. Evacuees must be represented by case managers. The deadline for submission is July 1.

### ■ **Lessons Learned from the 7/7 London Bombing**

The Greater London Authority issued a report this week on the July 7, 2005 bombings in the UK to identify the successes and failings of the response to the bombings, and to help improve things for the future. Fifty-two people were killed and hundreds injured by four suicide bombers on the London Underground and a bus in Tavistock Square. Richard Barnes, chairman of the London Assembly Report committee, states "...responders are dealing with individuals not an 'incident', and that all services must work together..." Findings conclude that the rescue operation was hampered by poor communication, a lack of basic medical supplies, and a failure to deal with survivors.

- **New Yorkers Not Preparing Themselves for a Disaster**

Based on a new report by the American Red Cross in Greater New York (ARC-GNY) and NYU's Center for Catastrophe Preparedness and Response (CCPR), although more New Yorkers are prepared for an emergency now than last year, they still do not have all the necessary supplies needed in case of an emergency. As a result of their findings, both of these organizations announced expanded efforts to help NY prepare for emergencies. "...We all still have so much more to accomplish," said Theresa A. Bischoff, CEO, ARC-GNY. These plans include offering more RNY trainings, making specific suggestions for preparing "Go Bags" for seniors, pets and children, and make preparedness materials available in all the boroughs in many different languages.

- **New DNA ID Techniques Gained from 9/11**

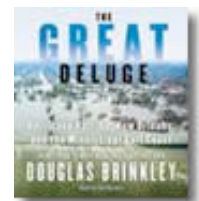
The DNA Shoah Project, a genetic database of holocaust victims' families, uses DNA techniques to identify the remains of holocaust survivors and find family members who don't know about each other. Remains of Holocaust victims continue to surface throughout Europe because of continual land development and until this project, there was no means to positively identify the victims. Made possible by advancements of DNA technology made from 9/11, these techniques may also be useful in the future identification of mass-graves projects.

The effects of how a disaster impacts a community are documented vividly in Douglas Brinkley's recently published chronicle of Hurricane Katrina's aftermath, *The Great Deluge: Hurricane Katrina, New Orleans, and the Mississippi Gulf Coast* (William Morrow), providing a comprehensive examination of what went wrong and the few things that went right as the events developed. With suspense and in detail, Brinkley covers the hurricane's effects and the government's response. In



describing one family's horror, he puts us right there, "...the wind was horrifying, but it was the storm surge that struck with cobralike suddenness...[the Dagnells'] daughter and her husband were each caught in the high branches of trees. Somehow the pony survived, too. Ralph and Joan Dagnell drowned along the coastline they loved, on the worst day it has ever known."
