- **NYC Katrina In-Service Training for Case Managers**

In May, NYDIS was awarded funding through 2006 to staff and host the NYC Katrina Unmet Needs Roundtable. Case managers working with Katrina or Rita survivors are required to attend an in-service training prior to presenting at the Roundtable. The purpose of these trainings is to provide case managers with a better understanding of the workings of the Roundtable and to help increase the likelihood that a client's needs could be funded.

The NYC Katrina Unmet Needs Roundtable aids case managers in securing cash assistance and to share resources to best meet the unmet needs of disaster victims so that they may regain self-sufficiency and recover from the impact of a disaster. The Roundtable helps to facilitate long-term recovery by supporting clients' recovery plans. ■ New 9/11 Recovery Worker Compensation & Registry

On August 14, Governor Pataki signed a bill that sets up a workers' compensation registry for workers and volunteers who did rescue, recovery or cleanup work after 9/11 and eliminates the two-year cut-off for filing a workers' compensation claim. By registering, workers and volunteers who are not sick will have the right to obtain workers' compensation if they become sick in the future. Those who are sick, but missed the 2003 deadline to file a claim, can register and file a claim at the same time. The new law also applies to volunteer workers. Anyone who has already been turned down for 9/11-related workers' compensation can file a new claim or register

under the new law. The deadline to file a claim or to register with the Workers' Compensation Board under the new law is August 14, 2007.

■ **FEMA's Crisis Counseling Grant for Upstate NY Floods**

FEMA has funded a \$393,804 grant to NYS provide immediate crisis counseling services for those affected by the late June flooding. Crisis counseling helps people deal with emotional reactions, such as sadness or anger, caused by stressful situations. Some primary services provided by the grant include: brief educational or supportive contact, individual and group crisis counseling, public education, assessment and referral, and community networking and support. The deadline for registration with FEMA is September 1, 2006.

■ DHS Raises Threat Level for UK/US Flights

After raising the threat level to "Severe", the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) announced on August 13 an adjustment in the aviation threat level to "High" for flights from the UK to the US. The US threat level is "High" for all domestic and international flights, and the ban on liquids and gels in carry on baggage remains in full effect. "The security measures already taken have allowed us to address an imminent threat of attack for flights between the UK and the US..." said Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff.

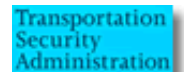

■ TSA Refines Carry-On Luggage Ban

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) will now permit small doses of non-prescription liquid medications through the security checkpoint and onboard airplanes. Passengers will also be required to remove their shoes so they may be X-rayed with their carry-on bags. Low blood sugar treatments including glucose gel for diabetics are now permitted, as well as baby food.

■ 9/11 Commission Chair Urges Vigilance

On Sunday, August 13, Meet The Press host, David Gregory, talked with 9/11 Commission chair, Gov. Tom Kean and vice-chair, Lee Hamilton on terrorism five years after 9/11, and in particular, after the UK threat discovered last week. Asked if we are any safer five years after 9/11, Gov. Kean responded, "I think we're safer, but we're not safe. There's still a number of things we should be doing



that we're not doing, and this should be a wake-up call. I mean this should, this just should, re-focus us on the whole thing."

On August 14, the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) put out a Fact Sheet about the two types of avian influenza (AI) that are both identified as H5N1. A difference exists in the virus classification; one is low-pathogenicity (LPAI) and the other is high-pathogenicity (HPAI). The HPAI H5N1 virus has infected people, most of whom have had direct contact with infected birds, but has not been detected in the US.
